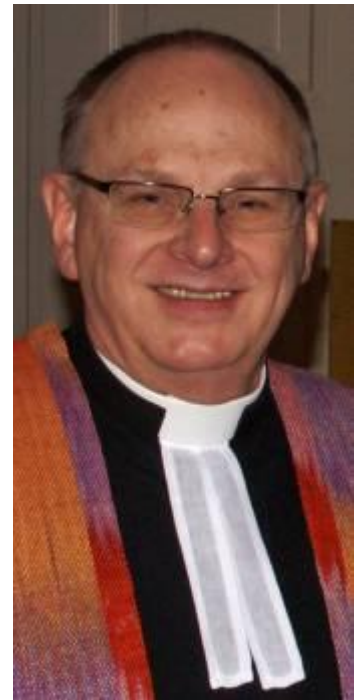
Rev. Spike's Retirement Celebration

Dear Friends in Christ,

Every Advent it happens. We have to deal with John the Baptist in the desert before we get to Jesus in Bethlehem. All four gospels begin with John in the desert saying, "Repent (a military term which means 'about face' or 'turn around'), for the kingdom of Heaven is close at hand."

Every time we hear John, it sounds like a threat. We don't respond well to threats and, hence, we don't like to listen to John. Every time we hear Jesus, it sounds like an invitation. We respond well to invitations. We love to listen to Jesus. Jesus' salvation is a gift, not a transaction.

Unfortunately, the church has majored in moving from invitation to threat. God is not amused by this. Perhaps that is why the church lacks the power it desires. Just as you don't want obnoxious Uncle Thereon to be invited to the family Christmas gathering in your home, but you have to; we likewise must invite Jesus' cousin to our gathering in Advent. John "cries out" because no one is listening. Perhaps that is Uncle Thereon's problem, too.

So, do we have the courage to hear John say things that established religions never want to hear? John says that religion needs constant reform and needs to realize that its message is often un-hearable. We definitely need to hear both John and Jesus. So this Christmas, don't avoid Uncle Thereon, or John the Baptist. They are the patron saints of everyone unheard in our world. John wakes us up in order for us to be able to listen to Jesus.

On **December 13**, the Third Sunday in Advent, we'll light the third candle in the Advent Wreath. The 11:15 a.m. Adult Ed class will continue the *Simply Christian* program.

On **December 20**, the children will lead worship with the musical interpretation of scripture through "Carriers of the Light" at the Fourth Sunday in Advent service and we'll light the fourth candle on the Advent Wreath.

December 24, Christmas Eve services: a Candlelight Family Service will be held at 5:00 p.m., Candlelight services, with Dr. Baxter preaching, will be held at 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.; a Candlelight service with Dr. Baxter preaching and Communion will be held at 11:00 p.m. Our Sanctuary choir will sing at the 7 pm, 9 pm and 11 pm services.

Thoughts from Dawn

It is December and as we prepare our hearts and homes for the birth of the Christ child, it weighs heavy on my heart and mind that the region where the Prince of Peace was born continues, 2,000 years later, to be ravaged by violence and hatred.

While the Middle East has a Christian presence, they are often associated with the West and the human costs of our war in Iraq. Since 2003, two million Iraqi refugees have fled to Jordan, Syria and Lebanon, while thousands of Iraqi civilians have died. Consequently, Arab Christians are facing persecution, economic hardship and discrimination. As a result, Christians are emigrating out of the Middle East. The nation of Lebanon, which at one time had a Christian majority, now reports that 35% of their population is Christian.

A Time of Stewardship

Now is the time for serious contemplation of your giving for the coming year. The stewardship campaign is in full swing and pledge cards have been distributed. It is clear that these are constrained times in our economy and special thoughts will need to be given about how you can support the church. Our church continues to prosper and grow particularly over the past few years. The excitement in programs, services and individuals is apparent and the ability for the church to continue to prosper is evident. We need your support! The opportunity to expand our reach to current and future members is available. With your help it will happen.

The facility

Our facility is terrific but it does need continual care and feeding. The trustees are responsible to insure that the appropriate maintenance and enhancements are done. Each month at the Trustee meetings a list of facility oriented items is reviewed and action/dollars are approved to insure that we continue to have a first-class place to study and worship. Examples of last month's decisions are a new furnace/AC serving the parlor, concrete repair in the lower level, courtyard planter box renovation, memorial garden improvements, installation of roof strips to minimize ice buildup, improved lighting in the kitchen and remodel of the downstairs bathrooms (Wishing Wall success.) Next month there will be new and continuing items; you can be assured that they will receive priority attention of the Trustees.

Work days are becoming an effective way for a number of smaller projects to be completed on our church building and grounds. A group of church members and their friends assemble for a 3 hour work session; skilled and unskilled workers are welcome. Good fun is had by all while important improvements are done. The next work day is November 12 at 9AM. Plan to attend and bring friends with you for a great time.

The Building Improvement Group continues to meet on a frequent basis to move this program to completion. The goal of the group is create an endowment intended to support the long-term maintenance and upgrade needs of our church building. The group is exploring options for conducting a capital

campaign during early 2010. More information to come shortly.
