Dear Friends in Christ,

The church needs to clean the lenses through which it looks at the world.. The lens cleaner issued to Christians has failed us and has kept us from seeing clearly. Christians are in need of a lens cleaner that will help them see more clearly when we look at each other and the world. William Blake said, "If the doors of perception were cleansed, everything would be seen as it is."

Richard Rohr states in his book *Everything Belongs: The Gift of Contemplative Prayer*: "I think Christianity has created a great problem in the Western world by repeatedly presenting itself, not as a way of seeing all things, but as one competing ideology among many. Instead of leading us to see God in new and surprising places, it too often has led us to confine God inside our place." Simone Weil, the brilliant French mystic, philosopher and resistor, said that "the tragedy of Christianity is that it came to see itself as replacing other religions instead of adding something to all of them."

More from Rohr: "The Gospel is not a competing idea. It's that by which we see all ideas in proper context. We believe as Christians that Jesus has given us the ideal eyes by which to see the real nature of reality. He does not lead with his judgments. When we lead with our judgments, we can't see correctly. When we lead with our fear, we can't see correctly. If we lead with the calculating mind, we'll never get to love. We'll cut down and close down too quickly. The heart is unable to remain open and we will not see God." As John of the Cross insists, "God refuses to be known except by love."

"The patterns [of great religions] are always the same. It's either fear or love. It's either illusion or love. It's either self-protection or love. Healthy religion is always about love." We shouldn't let our vision be clouded. Let's get the new lens cleaner distributed so that as Christians we never see anything except through the lens of love.

The FISH Food Pantry in Carpentersville, which services over 350 families each month, receives donations from churches, businesses, schools, other organizations and private individuals. The Dundee Dominick's grocery store had been a major contributor; however, its recent closing has had a huge impact on FISH. Our congregation has supported FISH with both our weekly donations to the Loaves and Fishes baskets and with our fall and spring food drives. They have been doing quite well this year until

recently. On my last trip to FISH, their shelves were very sparse and as I was bringing our shopping cart of contributions, they were taking food and diapers and giving them to people. It was disturbing for me and I would like to make a personal plea to the members of our congregation to continue to support FISH by bringing in food and toiletries on a weekly basis. Also, once your garden starts to produce, you can bring in fresh veggies. We'll have the green wheelbarrow ready to receive your donations.

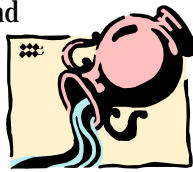

### Deacon's Corner, Bette Bilton

The majority of my time as a Deacon in the last two years has been spent on our church's hospitality program that provides weekly greeters and coffee service. As a new Deacon, I was asked to become the Deacon Hospitality coordinator. The program at that time, while providing coffee and greeters, was very time consuming for the Deacons who were spending endless hours attempting to contact parishioners by phone for Sunday volunteers. This frustrating and exhausting job eventually led to the creation of a hospitality team approach not unlike the existing usher program. With the superb assistance of Chris Schiller, I set to work over a year ago to devise a hospitality team plan that relied on willing volunteers.



With that idea in mind, we recruited interested parishioners to form hospitality teams that would commit to 2-3 Sundays a year as a team member to provide coffee service and greeters. The response was

wonderfully positive and the spaces were all quickly filled with interested and committed volunteers. We even had a sub list! It was inspirational to see the enthusiasm and the willingness to help in our church members.

After many hours on the computer with Chris, setting up emails, team schedules, committee schedules and even Dunkin Donut policies, the mechanics were in place and now my job was to make this all work and keep it going! Although it was somewhat daunting and challenging for me (especially on the computer!), I was just a little proud that my computer skills were improving and to be helping an important function, church hospitality, run a little smoother. Church members have been so supportive and no one has withdrawn from their teams since its inception! The bottom line is, I believe, that it's really kind of fun to serve people because that's what it's all about, to give of ourselves. So when I look back, at the time I have spent as a Deacon I get a nice little feeling inside and know it has been meaningful for me to serve as a Deacon of the Presbyterian Church of Barrington.

### Nancy Dolan Receives Recognition

McCormick Seminary is realizing what we at the Presbyterian Church of Barrington have known for a long time: Nancy Dolan is very special. Recently, Nancy has been awarded the Floyd V. Filson Prize for her essay on "The Allegory of Sarah and Hagar, Paul's Letter to the Galatians." This prize is awarded for the best essay in the field of the New Testament by students completing their first year. Nancy also received the Hugh McBirney Award in English Bible for her score of 96, the highest in her class, on the PC(USA) Bible Content Exam. This was the first ordination exam that Nancy must take and she credits much of her success to the work she did in Disciples I.

Nancy has recently finished the spring semester. Her courses included: History Survey II, Christian History from 1450 to the Present, Introduction to Pastoral Care and Conflict and Ministry. Although she has not received her grades yet, she is hopeful of great success. In the fall semester Nancy will be taking Hebrew and History Survey I, Christian History from the beginning of time to 1450.

As the Session Liaison for Nancy, I would like to congratulate her on her continuing success. Her dedication and the support from her family and the members of the congregation have been outstanding.
