Dear Friends in Christ,

On June 28th, we will hear the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee's candidate preach during worship and following that worship service we will gather in a Called Congregational meeting to vote about extending a call to our new Associate Pastor. We will also have the opportunity to thank Jane Zimmer and the other members of Associate Pastor Nominating Committee for their diligent work in finding this exceptional candidate. Immediately, after the meeting, if all has gone well, we will meet in Fellowship Hall to welcome our New Associate Pastor and family. I am very excited about this candidate and I look forward to working with this colleague on our Ministry Team. The day of our new Associate Pastor's election will be a time

of great celebration and joy for me, our Ministry Team and our entire congregation.

If you have never been through the pastoral search process, there is desire on the part of the nominating committee and the pastoral candidate to sense and feel close to God when making a decision about a call to serve a particular church family. At the time of decision-making, both parties sense and feel close to God who has been with them and that presence has made all the difference through the whole search process. For the rest of us, God can only be seen and felt clearly when we pay attention and wait to hear the candidate and the report of the committee. And so, I thought that I might take this opportunity to describe God as I know God. Here is my incomplete attempt:

1. God does not will pain or evil. Both are allowed to happen in a world which God has endowed with the ability to be itself; a world in which God has the last word.

2. God's action within the cloudiness of an unpredictable open process will always be hidden. God's presence cannot be demonstrated by experiment, though it may be discerned by faith. God's nature also limits what is sensible to pray for. The early Christian theologian Origen recognized that one should not pray for the cool of spring in the heat of summer. (And I would add: nor to pray for the Cubs to win the World Series without a great closer on the relief pitching staff!)

3. God does not take us away from anything, but promises to be with us through all things and that presence makes all the difference.

4. God (here comes the double negative) cannot NOT know joy or suffer when you do.

5. God does not know the future. God is, however, ready for it and **God is not caught unprepared;** but even God does not know beforehand what the outcome of a free process or a free action will be.

Only when we pay attention and wait do we sense and feel close to God and through faith know God's guiding presence in our lives.

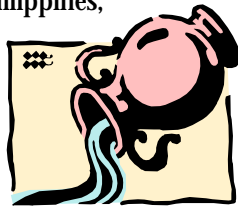

Deacon's Corner, Emmie Helfrick

It has always been my desire to reach out to people. But this desire of reaching out has been far from reality as my family and I are very new in this country and in the community. We came from the Philippines, and English is our second language. We made this major move in 2007. It has been a huge adjustment in all aspects of our life and as a new family. My kids sometimes find it difficult emotionally and mentally to live and fit in to this new environment. Living as a new family takes a lot of effort and strong faith especially as we are of different cultures, backgrounds, and life experiences. I don't know all the answers, but I do know God's love for us is greater and stronger above all things. And perhaps, God is sending these trials to develop our gifts. We have some gifts that would never have been discovered if not for trials. Our love for Him is all too often like a firefly, showing little light except when surrounded by darkness.



God said: Be strong! Be courageous! Don't be afraid. For the Lord your God will be with you. He will never fail you nor forsake you (Deuteronomy 31:6). Yes, He did keep his promise. He provided us not only a nice

home but most of all a loving and caring step-dad to my kids who is in fact also very willing to learn how to be a good dad. The church leaders and members are very supportive to us. God wants us to use the gifts, talents and opportunities He gives to us to benefit others. TRUSTEE'S CORNER

Gifts for Your Church's Future

A wonderful way for you to make a significant long-term impact on the Presbyterian Church of Barrington is to make a financial contribution above and beyond your annual pledge. Significant donations enable the church to tackle projects such as major repairs and improvements, expansion of the church building to serve a larger congregation, funding specific programs and/or providing funds for future generations of church members.

There are a number of ways you can leave a legacy to the church:

- make a bequest to the PCB in your will or living trust,
- name the PCB as a beneficiary of your life insurance policy or IRA,
- establish a Charitable Remainder Trust or other plan providing lifetime income to you with the remainder designated for the church, or
- give a gift in your lifetime.

Gifts may include cash, stock, bonds, real estate, or other assets of value. Designating the church as a beneficiary of your will, insurance policy, IRA or trust offers the advantage of making the gift after you are sure not to need the funds yourself. In addition, these various ways of giving have tax and estate planning advantages.

You have the option of designating how your gift is to be used:

- A general purpose gift can be directed by the church to where the need is greatest. This gives the church the most flexibility in the use of the funds.
- A gift can also be designated for one or more specific purposes. For example, you may designate the funds to be used for care and maintenance of the church building, building expansion, Christian education, music program, mission, or other purposes.

You also have the option of making the gift immediately available when it is received by the church, or directing the gift to the Endowment Fund. The PCB Endowment Fund preserves the principal so that

ongoing investment gains and earnings are provided to the church.
