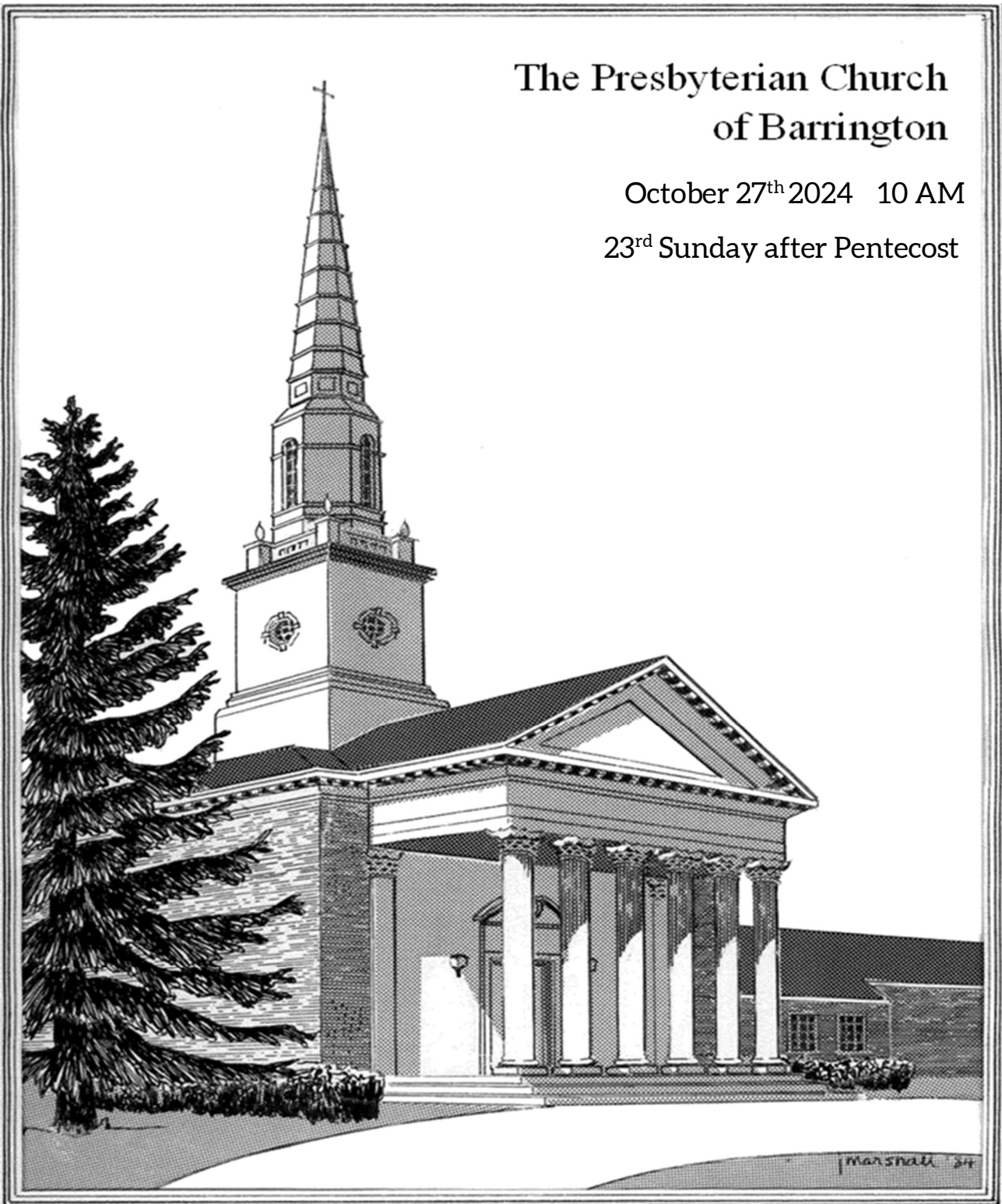

Presbyterians celebrate the tradition that grounds their faith in this event and posits their heritage in their Scottish ancestors. Hence the skirling of the bagpipes on this Sunday.
