## Pastor’s Desk

### What is Lent?

In AD 325 in the city of Nicea outside Constantinople, now Istanbul in modern-day Turkey, all of the bishops of Christendom gathered for a conference that is now known as the First Ecumenical Council of Nicea. This was the first time since the beginnings of the Church that all of the leaders had gathered to discuss doctrine and Church practice. Until the early 300’s, sporadic persecution had forced many Christian communities to operate under the radar.

The main purpose of this council was to combat a rapidly growing heresy called “Arianism” that was threatening the basic belief that Jesus was both human and divine. Also at this council many matters of Christian practice and doctrine were discussed, and it was here that we first have a written record of the practice of “Lent,” the forty days prior to Easter.

In AD 348, Bishop Cyril of Jerusalem instructed all candidates for Baptism to observe forty days of prayer and meditation in order to prepare themselves for Baptism. Baptismal candidates were given a final examination, called “scrutinies,” and the days of Lent were the final “cramming” period for this exam. In the early days, the Church performed Baptisms only on Easter Sunday, and so these forty days of preparation were the same forty days as Lent. By the time of St. Augustine, about AD 375, Lent had become a time of reflection, repentance, and preparation for Easter for all Christians, not just those preparing for Baptism.

Traditionally, the Church is decorated in purple during Lent because Lent is a “penitential season,” or a time of inward reflection and sorrow for sins. As a result, the church has called for the elimination of spoken or sung “Alleluias” during the Lenten season because “Alleluia” means “praise the Lord” and is considered to be too joyful to use during a season of sorrow and penitence. When Easter arrived, the church welcomed the “Alleluia” back into worship with great joy and celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Let this Lenten season be a time of self-examination, reflection, listening, and discernment as we journey together towards the ultimate celebration of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

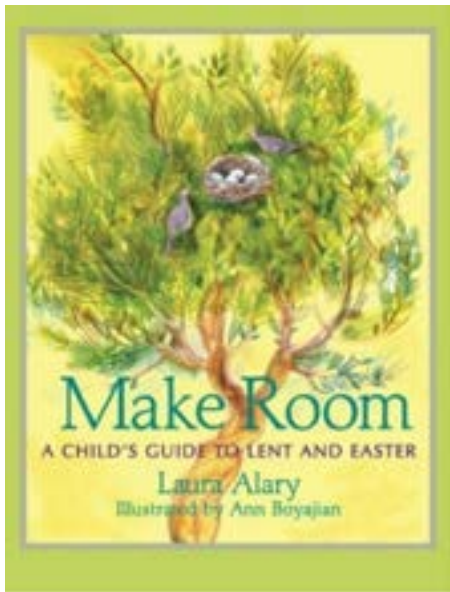
## Christian Education Invites You to Experience Lent

We find ourselves once again in Lent and the stories of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. These stories of healing, teaching, and promises are not new, but we are a forgetful people that need to be reminded to listen, to hear about the love God has for each of us; no matter what. The Christian Education team invites you to dive into the stories with us and experience them in a new way.

## Children's Sunday School

Our focus this Lent will be learning ways to Make Space, Make Time, and Make Room for Jesus in our lives by praying. We will hear the stories, learn new ways of talking with God, and practice many ways we can listen for God's word. We have chosen the book, *Make Room: A Child's Guide to Lent and Easter* by Laura Alary as our guide and compliment to the lectionary. The author notes that Lent "always emphasized limits: self-denial, sacrifice and death. But as I recalled the joyful freedom of praying in color, I felt that what I wanted to share with my children was a sense of spaciousness: freedom, choice, openness to new ways of seeing and being, and above all, the awesome expansiveness of divine love." Ms. Alary goes on to say "one of the defining stories of the Lenten season is of Jesus in the Wilderness "and as she meditated on the story, she "began to notice the quality of space" Jesus had when you went into the desert. "He leaves behind clutter and distraction. He seeks out a still place where he can listen and wonder about his own identity and the way he needs to go. The path he chooses is also defined by making space. Jesus continually makes room and stretches the limits of who is welcome. He does not cling to possessions, power, prestige or life. Jesus empties himself to make room for something new-something better."

Children are invited to gather for worship each Sunday where they will help lead the Time with Young Disciples before going to Sunday School. We will not have class on March 23 and 30th.

We invite people to bring a percussion-type instrument of their choice for the parade (drums or a pot & wooden spoon, chimes, bells, tambourines, wood blocks, noisemakers, etc.), although helping hands will also be needed for carrying balloons and streamers.

## Senior Pastor Search

### March, 2025 Pastor Search Update

In late February, your Pastor Search Committee (PSC) exhausted the list of candidates provided through the Presbytery's database of pastors seeking positions, as well as other sources of candidates that have been pursued. In reviewing a total of 83 candidates over a period of months, 75 were initially dismissed as not being qualified according to criteria set by feedback from the congregation survey or other criteria. The remaining 8 candidates were invited to continue consideration with PCB. Of those, 3 chose not to be considered and the remaining 5 were reviewed a second time by the committee and deemed not qualified.

As a result, on Sunday, February 23 your PSC voted to call **Dr. David Ezekiel** as the new Senior Pastor and Head of Staff of the Presbyterian Church of Barrington. This was done as the committee determined that it had completed full compliance with the directive provided by the congregation, including all due diligence to identify available candidates. The committee has subsequently informed the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry and PCB's Session of this decision.

While there remain I's to be dotted and T's to be crossed in this process, we expect a formal call to be issued by the PCB Session at its next meeting in March. Pastor David has indicated his intention to accept this call when officially issued.

Your Pastor Search Committee appreciates the many comments received from the congregation regarding the pastor search process and wants to encourage individuals to continue to share any questions and comments they may have. ## Pastoral Care

### Deacons

The Deacons are devoted to our mission of caring for the sick, the heartbroken, the needy and the lonely of our congregation. Each Deacon is assigned a geographical area or parish as their responsibility. We are in contact with our Parish members to discern if they are in need of our help and we are also advised by our Pastors of those in need.

### Stephen Ministry – The Ministry of Listening

Six listening concepts are used in Stephen Ministry to let care receivers know their needs are heard and their feelings acknowledged. They are listened to, instead of being told what they should feel or do.

#### Listening is Active

The focus is on the person and what they have to say. Making eye contact, turning off the phone, tuning out distractions are all ways we let the person know what they have to share is important.

#### Listening is Patient

Listening means giving our full attention and allowing time for the individual to gather their thoughts, clarify what they want us to hear, and repeat their feelings and concerns as often as they need to.

#### Listening involves more than words.

We listen not only to what is said but also to what is not said. Listen to not only the words but how it's said. Does body language agree or contradict the spoken words?

#### Good listeners aren't completely quiet

Restating in our words a thought or idea we heard gives us the chance to make sure we heard what the speaker said and the speaker a chance to hear if that is what they meant. Asking focused questions not only gives us better understanding but also gives the speaker the chance to reach a little deeper.

#### Listening happens over time

One conversation might build upon an earlier one. Do you hear recurring thoughts or patterns? Are there any contradictions from what was said earlier? These are signs there may be more to explore.

#### Listening is confidential

Confidentiality builds trust and indicates how much we care. Confidentiality is what makes Stephen Ministry the "silent ministry."
