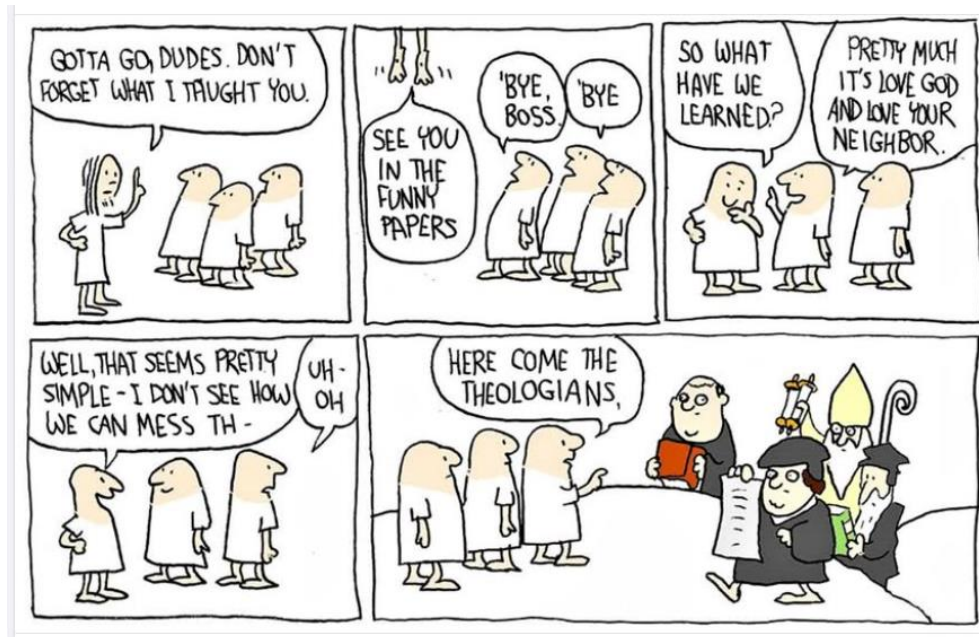

Session meets this Monday evening in the parlor at 6:30pm with the confirmands and regular monthly meeting afterward.

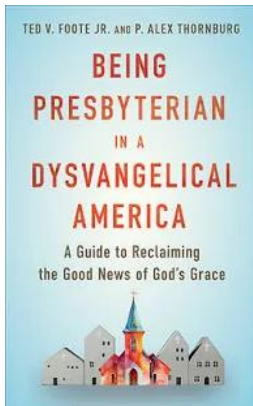
## Sunday Flowers - Donations & Dedications

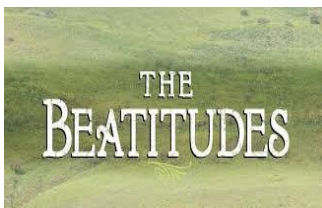
