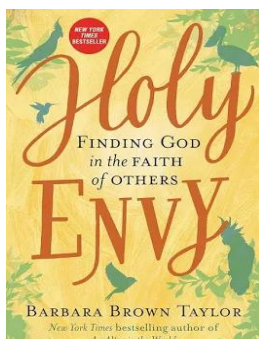
And we’re not meant to do this alone – instead we are made for community and relationships with others. In fact, we’re invited to value other people above ourselves, just like Jesus did.

### Holy Envy by Barbara Brown Taylor



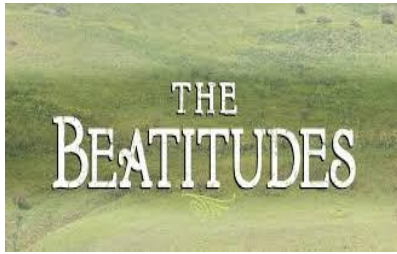
Our next book study starts this Wednesday June 24
